Afternoon Tour I: Perge, Aspendos

(November 9, 2025 / 13:00 - 19:30)



Our tour, which appeals to history and ancient era enthusiasts, includes a visit to Perge, located 48 km from the hotel. According to legend, this ancient city, founded by the Trojans under the leadership of the seer Calchas, will undoubtedly capture your attention. These Roman-era ruins and monuments offer a rich variety: the Roman theater, the impressive stadium with a capacity of 10,000 people, the city's Hellenistic gate, the Agora, the Roman Baths, the colonnaded main street, the fountain, and the stepped canal are all worth seeing.

The nearby ancient Greco-Roman city of Aspendos (50 km away) is located on the Eurymedon (Köprüçay) River. It was one of the first cities to mint its own coins in the 5th century BC and was the largest city of Ancient Pamphylia, once the cultural and commercial center of the southern region of Anatolia. The well-preserved and restored Aspendos amphitheater, built in 155 AD, has become a significant tourist attraction. Previously accommodating up to 55,000 spectators, it features excellent acoustics and stage design. Today, it is used for major cultural events, festivals, and concerts.

Afternoon Tour II: Olympos, Phaselis

(November 10, 2025 / 13:00 - 19:00)



The ancient city of Olympos takes its name from Mount Tahtalı, which was formerly called Mount Olympos, and it is one of the most important cities of ancient Lycia. The foundations of the structures in the ancient city of Olympos date back to the early Hellenistic period. It is an ideal destination for a vacation, as it has been designated and protected as a conservation area for the nesting grounds of *Caretta Carettas*. The area features treehouses and open spaces, and as you descend from the hills, you can witness the breathtaking view of the blue Mediterranean Sea through the lush green pine trees.

Phaselis is built on a peninsula between its northern and southern harbors. The northern harbor is divided into three sections: the northern harbor, the military harbor, and the southern harbor. The harbor and these archaeological ruins are among the must-see and must-learn highlights of the Phaselis tour.

Afternoon Tour III: Antalya Old Town

(November 12, 2025 / 13:00 - 19:00)



It is the oldest part of the city of Antalya and houses numerous historical artifacts from various civilizations. The most famous of these include the ancient Hadrian's Gate, the Clock Tower, the Yivli Minaret, and the ancient harbor.

Kaleiçi is also renowned for its narrow, winding streets and approximately 3,000 authentic old houses, most of which have been restored and transformed into boutique hotels, shops, and restaurants. The area is surrounded by ancient walls, contributing to its historic ambiance. Visitors can enjoy exploring the charming streets, shopping for souvenirs, and experiencing the lively atmosphere.
